

INCUMBENT'S REPORT TO VESTRY - 2020

My sisters and brothers in Christ, Grace and Peace to you.

It is a privilege to offer you this report on the life of Christ Church and Holy Trinity Church over the past year.

I want to begin with a special thank you to you all for your loving and generous support this past year of myself personally. The year really began with my going on medical leave for almost 7 weeks. During this time I felt the warmth and kindness of many in the parish – notes, prayers, and delicious meals for Thomas and I dropped off to our home. It was a reminder of what a caring and giving parish ours is. At the end of the year I received from both congregations a generous financial gift. I am so very thankful to be a member of this parish, and to be able to call you friends. You all have blessed my family and I immensely.

This past year has been an odd one, to say the least. My return from leave was met immediately with the pandemic shutdown and closure of our churches for worship. Suddenly, we were cut off from each other; no longer able to meet face to face, nor to worship together. We have been blessed that we live in an area with a low risk. Nevertheless, caution was taken, especially by the Diocese.

We quickly adapted, particularly with our worship. We owe our gratitude to Mike Venables who became our videographer and editor, putting together our online worship week by week. Our Lay Readers – Ann Martin, Keith Stanton, Rob Peck, and Tara Cameron have been a great support as we changed the style of our worship and their roles in it. As always, Scott and Tara Cameron were willing to adapt to the many changes, and continue to offer us great musical support.

And then there are all of you our members – willing to be filmed at home as readers and intercessors. Thank you all for providing us with some great online worship. Thank you all for your patience as we climbed a steep hill of learning. Patience not only with our online endeavours, but also with significant changes in how we present our worship when in church. In both churches we have installed large screens to project the service for all in attendance – a change which I have desired (and for which I have been teased by some of you 😊)

I – we – are indebted to our Wardens over the past year. They have worked very hard keeping things working, and to stay on top of the many administrative changes. They have attended regular online meetings with the Diocese, keeping up to date with the many changing policies and protocols.

A quick note about finances. First, thank you to Jill McDonald-Johnston and Maria Ferguson our Treasurers for their gift of energy and skill. This year has seen a number of significant additions to their work, particularly record keeping of government grants. Despite our being away from regular attendance, you as a parish have been incredibly generous and supportive this past year. On top of that, at the end of the year, you responded with open hands to a call to assist a woman in dire need of financial help. You proved once again that ours is a caring parish willing to respond to a call for help. Lastly, despite the many restrictions, our Anglican Church Women were able to make a generous offering to Holy Trinity, following their successful Tourtiere Sale.

A special thanks to Gordon and Bev Tallman, who made a magnificent gift to the congregation of Christ Church. This bequest will provide financial security to both the church and the cemetery for years to come, and an annual gift to support needy families in our area.

We now head into a new year, one which still holds many unknowns for us. In the midst of the continuing pandemic many questions can be raised about our mission and ministry and about our future as a parish. The current pandemic has changed our lives in a variety of ways – some temporary, and others likely permanent. It has, I hope, given us pause to reflect on how we have lived our lives, and how we might choose to live them as we move forward. This too should be true for we the Church. As individual congregations, and as a parish we need to confront the new realities. How do we worship together with reduced numbers? What is the way forward with our continued financial challenges? What moral questions (stewardship, environmental) must we face holding worship in a large building with only 15 present? What is Christ calling to do in the midst of our new realities? **“For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it.”** Some of these are, of course, old questions. Yet they all can be approached with the new sight given us by this pandemic.

Despite the challenges of this past year, it has been my joy to be your priest and to include you among my friends. This parish has truly become a home for me – not only welcoming, but encouraging. And not only encouraging for myself, but for those who join with us. We always have more work to do, but your willingness to accept new and diverse people is a great grace. Christ is present in our congregations.

INCUMBENT'S REPORT TO THE VESTRIES FOR 2020

My sisters and brothers in Christ, Grace and Peace to you.

How does one begin a report, looking back on a year such as 2020? I am reminded of Her Majesty's speech at the end of 1992, in which she described the year as an "*annus horribilis*" – a horrible year. For many around the world, and close to home, it was indeed that. The pandemic brought a new illness, fear, isolation, unemployment, lockdowns, and so much more. It was a year to be remembered, and yet to be forgotten.

We in the church were particularly touched in 2020. We are the Body of Christ, a community gathered in Jesus' name, to worship, and to serve. Central to our worship is the Eucharist – a meal we share with each other and with the living Jesus. It is difficult to be a community when we can not actually gather together. Oh the things we have missed – smiles, hugs, conversation, choral music, bread and wine, body and blood, praying, laughing – and the list goes on. Yet, we are a servant people, and people of hope. Across our region we saw this lived out in many ways.

This was the year much of the church "entered the 21st century" as we moved into the virtual world. When we could gather in small groups, we did so. And when we could not (much of the past year), we found new means to do so. Our Regional ministry has developed innovative ways to offer our praise and prayers, particularly by going online. At St. James, especially through the energy and dedication of Robin Hooper, a whole new virtual ministry has been developed. Each Sunday the service is live-streamed through Facebook from St. James. In the Parish of Merrickville an online presence has developed as well, with a special thanks to Mike Venables. Our online offerings in the Region have included not only Sunday worship, but also Zoom meetings, study groups, mid-week worship. Notable have been the Regional worship services, especially our Advent Carol Service, in which all our churches were involved. While this can not replace our physically gathering together, it has been key in keeping us connected.

Beyond all this, there is, not surprisingly, little to report. So many of our activities have been cancelled due to the necessity of keeping people distanced and safe. I do note that despite the reduction of our usual fundraising efforts, you have all been very supportive financially of our ministry. This expression of your faith and hope in God is a great gift.

So, where do we go from here? Much of this depends upon the direction life takes with the reality of COVID. However, in Christ there is much we can do, and good reason to be hopeful. "Emmanuel" – God is with us – is the great promise of our Lord. "I am with you to the end." Much of the Old Testament was a response to the Hebrew people being taken into exile from their land. Yet they were reminded that God had not forgotten them, and they kept their faith. Indeed, their faith was renewed. How is God calling us now to renew our faith, and how we express it? What directions are we to take as the Body of Christ; not only in the middle of this pandemic, but also in its aftermath? The pandemic has challenged our notions of how to live as a church; how will we serve differently after this? What is God calling to do, and to be?

I want to finish simply, with a word of gratitude. At the beginning of 2020 I went on a medical leave. During that time I experienced much kindness and support. The prayers of many were a deep blessing. The meals that Thomas and I received were not only delicious, but a much needed spiritual nurture. I am thankful too for the work of so many to keep our life together moving forward.

Our Region is blessed with many faithful people and leaders. In Fr. Robert we have a priest who loves the Lord, and is filled with energy. Our Church Wardens work very hard to keep things working – especially hard this past year with its extra stresses.

As we enter the season of Lent, I hope that we will walk together with Jesus towards Jerusalem. I pray that this is our pilgrimage throughout the year ahead.

Christ Church Anglican Cemetery – Report 2020

While we all experienced many changes, challenges, opportunities and sorrows this year, one constant was the deep-felt appreciation, care and attachment the Christ Church family holds for its cemetery.

I would like to acknowledge the tremendous support and assistance provided to Christ Church Cemetery, both in financial terms and in physical labour, to maintain and secure the future of our cemetery.

I would like to recognize and thank the members of the Cemetery Board for their support, guidance and assistance. Members include Larry Donoghue, Don Tallman, Greg Johnston, Don Patterson, the Wardens - Bob Parnell and George Hawkins, and Reverend Andrew Wilson.

The Christ Church Cemetery Board would like to gratefully acknowledge the Tallman Family who generously created an endowment fund which will provide the Cemetery with an ongoing source of funds, thereby contributing greatly to its future financial security.

I would like to thank Ms. Abby Johnston and Green Acres for their diligent work in keeping the cemetery and church lawns neatly mown.

I would also like to thank Mr. Don Patterson and Mr. George Hawkins and two other generous members of the Parish for their work in removing the stumps and dead trees from the cemetery grounds.

There was no cemetery service this year. Conditions willing, a service will be held in 2021.

There was one interment in 2020, following all Diocesan and Provincial COVID protocols.

There was one sale of an interment right this year.

After much debate, it was decided to sell the tractor which was formerly used by dedicated volunteers to mow the lawns of the Church and Cemetery. The tractor was sold for \$2500.00 and included the removal of the storage building.

I would like to thank Mr. Tanner Johnston for all his skilled work in returning the tractor to running condition, increasing its value and sale price.

The Board decided that the money from the sale of the tractor, plus an additional matching amount of \$2500.00 (for a total of \$5000.00) be aside to create a fund to be used towards the purchase of new mowing equipment if conditions warrant such an action in the future.

Work will continue in 2021 to Cemetery grounds, including grinding of the stumps, brush removal and possible further cutting.

Finally, I would like to thank the entire congregation for their support of the Cemetery.
